# **IN THE BEGINNING**

#### 200

- Q: Steve Martin, Diane Sawyer, and Bob Marley were born, the Second World War ended, and LWR was formed in this year.
- A: What is 1945.

# 400

- **Q:** The 20th century war that left approximately 1/5 of the world's Lutheran's homeless.
- A: What is World War II.

# 600

- Q: These are the flags of the countries where LWR first worked OUTSIDE of Europe. Your answer is the name of one of them. (players must name only one of 6 countries)
- A: What is: Bangladesh, India, Korea, Hong Kong, Palestine, or Israel?

#### 800

- Q: LWR works with these people and organizations to be closer to the communities we serve around the world! (Hint: You might work with one of these on a school project.)
- A: What are partners?

# 1000

- Q: After learning of the bad conditions in Europe after WW II U.S. Lutherans with German and Scandinavian backgrounds began LWR because of their care for these people.
- A: What are friends, family, relatives or other Lutherans.

# WHAT'S IN THE NAME?

#### 200

- Q: LWR is an acronym that stands for \_\_\_\_\_.
- A: What is Lutheran World Relief?

# 400

- Q: This is the word that means "walking with people" and not "doing for," or the piano part in a choral arrangement.
- A: What is accompaniment.

#### 600

- **Q:** According to LWR's mission statement, God's love extends to this many people,
- A: What is ALL people?

#### 800

- **Q:** God's promise for the world, mentioned in LWR's motto, is this. Hint: Does it ever end?
- A: What is Lasting?

# 1000

- Q: Gratitude, Calling, Accompaniment, Stewardship, and Innovation are all these for LWR and Lutherans. Hint: this word is something of great worth.
- A: What are values?



# GLOBAL

# 200

- **Q:** This is a safe school program in San Ramon, Nicaragua (Pictures of program). The school is preparing for these 2 natural disasters that can happen during the rainy season.
- A: What are floods and landslides?

# 400

- Q: This is a treatable disease, common in developing countries, carried by a mosquito. LWR works to educate communities about it, especially through churches in countries like Tanzania.
- A: What is Malaria.

#### 600

- **Q:** India is one country where LWR supports agriculture. If you had a small farm in India, these are 3 possible things that you might need to grow more food to eat or sell.
- A: (any combination of answers may be accepted, and youth leader may choose to accept answers that are not listed) What are seeds, fertilizer, pesticides, knowledge, biodiversity, irrigation structures or techniques, good soil, equipment and/or adequate water?

# 800

- Q: This is a natural disaster that is a violent tropical storm or hurricane, especially occurring in the West Pacific region. (Hint: A storm by the name of Haiyan happened in November 2013, hitting the Philippines especially hard.
- A: What is a typhoon?

# LWR TRIVIA QUESTIONS

# 1000

- O: Double Difference Maker! The player who has chosen this question will be the only one allowed to answer. The slide will prompt the player to choose a wager before answering. (Click the link at the top of the slide to proceed to the question.) The question slide has an LWR video about Lasting Solutions to Hunger in Peru. Watch the video and then ask the player to answer the question: People have left Peru because of political problems and extreme weather conditions. This is a reason why people like Daisy's family might stay.
- A: A list of possible answers are: What is family/ancestral heritage or connection, no money to buy other land or a new house. or knowledge of the land/crop has been passed down and that's how families know how to make a living. This question is intended to give youth a chance to think about why families in poverty cannot or will not pick up everything and move or start over if the situation in their homeland becomes difficult. This is a good place in the game to pause for conversation, if desired.

# **FROM THE GROUND UP**

#### 200

- Q: This crop helps with reforestation in Central America, and helps farmers make more money from their produce. It is eventually made into a tasty treat!
- A: What is cacao or cocoa?

#### 400

- Q: Farmers in Uganda have been able to increase their incomes by learning new techniques and improving quality of this crop.
  (Hint: The beans from the crop are fermented, dried, roasted, and ground before they make their way to a mug during breakfast.
  Many churches have a whole hour devoted to this crop on Sundays!)
- A: What is coffee?

# 600

- Q: Farmers don't always get a fair price for their produce in many countries, but switching to a Fair Trade company can help a lot! This is one thing that typically improves for a farmer when they become Fair Trade Certified.
- A: A variety of answers are acceptable: What is increased income, stable prices, improved safety regulations, lessened environmental impact, or democratic and transparent governance among farmers?

#### 800

- **Q:** This small, herd animal with curved horns can provide milk, meat, and increased income to many women farmers and their families in Burkina Faso.
- A: What is a goat.



#### 1000

- Q: This farming practice is necessary in areas where it is very dry for most of the year.
- A: What is irrigation.

# FAITH IN ACTION

#### 200

- **Q:** LWR sent 261,580 School Kits around the world in 2013. Each Kit contains 5 pencils and 5 pens. This is the number of writing utensils that Lutherans distributed in 2013.
- A: What is 2,615,800.

#### 400

- **Q:** These gifts of warmth, made by Lutherans in the U.S. have made their way to the Mother of Mercy Women's House (Peru), which welcomes youth, single mothers, orphans and the elderly who want to learn a trade.
- A: What are Quilts or mission Quilts.

#### 600

- **Q:** Personal hygiene is important in times of disaster to help prevent spread of disease and protect a person's God given dignity. These are 2 items that Lutherans share when they assemble an LWR Personal Care Kit.
- A: What are (any combination of) a towel, a bar of soap, a toothbrush, a comb, or a nail clipper.

# LWR TRIVIA QUESTIONS

# 800

- **Q:** A prenatal health care worker in Mali might distribute Kits with clothes, blankets, towels, and soap, to mothers for this important person in her life.
- A: What is her baby?

# 1000

- Q: LWR and our partners can teach a person to stitch, repair, and make clothing or other textiles, so they can earn an income and break out of poverty, with these two items donated through a Kit from U.S. Lutherans.
- A: What are fabric and thread in our Fabric Kits?

# POVERTY

# 200

- Q: DAILY DOUBLE! The player who has chosen this question will be the only one allowed to answer. The slide will prompt the player to choose a wager before answering. (Click the link at the top of the slide to proceed to the question.) Food Insecurity, means not having enough food to eat, AND not having money or means to get enough. The phrase, food insecurity, is often referred to using this common term.
- A: What is Hunger.

# 400

- Q: Think that all people who need water don't have any nearby? Think again! An open water container without proper sanitation and maintenance might cause this problem for families in poverty.
- A: What is illness or disease?

# 600

- Q: Roughly 70% of people in developing countries work in this industry. You could say they know much more about where their food comes from than you and I do!
- A: What is agriculture or farming?

# 800

- **Q:** From January-March of 2014, almost 27,000 new people arrived at Kakuma Refugee Camp in Kenya. Almost 11,000 new arrivals were children ages 6-17, mostly from South Sudan. This is the surprising percentage of youth who arrived at the camp early in 2014.
- A: What is about 40%.

# 1000

- **Q:** Small holder farmers around the world are feel harsh effects of changing climates and decreasing produce. These are 2 things that farmers can change to make their crops a little tougher, or their land a little better.
- A: What is growing different things (diversification), planting tougher seeds (climate smart seeds), and changing the planting and harvesting times, being a little nicer to the soil by...1) putting vegetation on the ground (other plants to prevent runoff and fix nitrogen) 2) Farming on different terrain, like a hill 3) Composting 4) Planting helpful trees around the crop (more native or hardwood trees) 4) Not tilling the soil 5) catching the water that would otherwise runoff from rain
