



THE CHALLENGE: AN ACCESS GAP IN CRISIS SETTINGS

Millions of people, especially women, adolescent girls, and displaced populations, face severe barriers to care. For many, seeking care can be dangerous or impossible.

THE SOLUTION: MOBILE CLINICS

Mobile clinics are agile, rapidly deployable health units that bring essential services directly to communities when permanent facilities are unavailable. They are staffed with skilled clinical health professionals and supported by community health workers for outreach and follow-up.

In fragile, remote, and conflict-affected settings, mobile health clinics supported by faith-based organizations (FBOs) are trusted and committed to reaching those left behind by traditional health systems.

Why They Work

- Transportable and adaptable to context
- Rapid deployment during emergencies
- Effective in remote, disaster, and conflict zones
- Designed to ensure dignity, safety, and access



What Services They Deliver

- Maternal, newborn, and child health (MNCH)
- Antenatal and postnatal care
- Immunization services
- Mental health and psychosocial support
- Nutrition screening and treatment
- Screening for chronic diseases (diabetes, hypertension)

- Protection, confidentiality, and safety central to design


