Health systems strengthening – Successful care and treatment of individuals require integrated, holistic and sustainabile health system with adequate supplies, essential management capabilities, and other behind-the-scenes support and infrastructure necessary to meet the ongoing health needs of large populations.

What We Do

IMA World Health is a faith-based nonprofit and member organization that provides essential health care services and medical supplies to people in need in developing countries. Working with local health ministries and governments, IMA identifies the health needs of populations and creates customized solutions to prevent and fight diseases, improve maternal and child health, and much more—sometimes through direct provision to hospitals and clinics, and other times through efforts to strengthen health care systems through training and education of health workers, technical assistance, and supervision.

IMA and Partnership

Between 30 and 70 percent of health care in the developing world is delivered by faith-based institutions. IMA World Health has a long history of partnership with Christian health organizations and health facilities, especially in Africa, as well as longstanding collaborative relationships with governments, secular groups, and corporations. This dedication to partnership and breaking down barriers gives IMA a unique, multifaceted approach to advancing health.

IMA also has established relationships with pharmaceutical and medical supply manufacturers, service organizations, churches, and international funding agencies such as the U.S. Agency for International Development (USAID), The World Bank, and the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention.

Medicines and Supplies



Zoal, a South Sudanese doctor, has just completed an emergency obstetrics course facilitated by IMA to help save the lives of women like his wife, who passed away from complications in childbirth.
