A Second Chance at Life

In March, Veronica was diagnosed with **Burkitt's Lymphoma**, a highly aggressive childhood cancer that affects hundreds of children in Tanzania each year.

Fortunately BL is treatable with chemotherapy, and the success rates are very high when the appropriate treatment regimen is followed.

After she'd been admitted to the hospital on July 20, doctors started Veronica on chemotherapy cycles. Since then, the swelling has begun to subside, and she's continuing to receive therapy.

Thanks to you, thousands of children like Veronica have a second chance at life.

Stopping Violence Against Women

Mawaza was attacked by a male nurse at a local hospital. She was a poor woman from a distant village in the DR Congo who had few local connections.

She found support in a **USHINDI** safe house and was given the opportunity to recover from the attack both physically and mentally. The program even provided her with a lawyer to help bring her attacker to justice.

IMA is a key partner in the **USHINDI** program; a USAID-Funded program that provides responsive care and supports victims in eastern provinces of DR Congo where the epidemic of rape and abuse of women and girls is most severe.

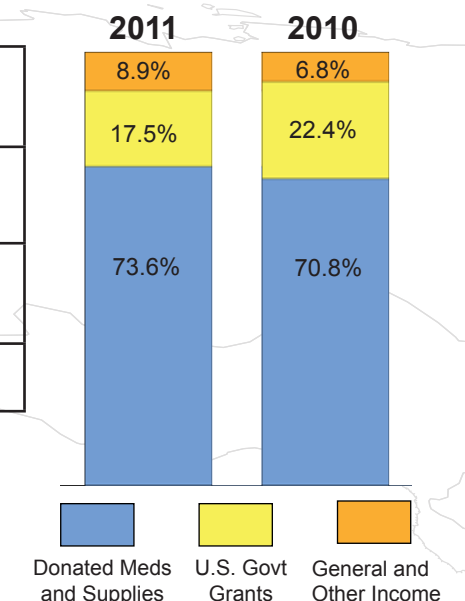

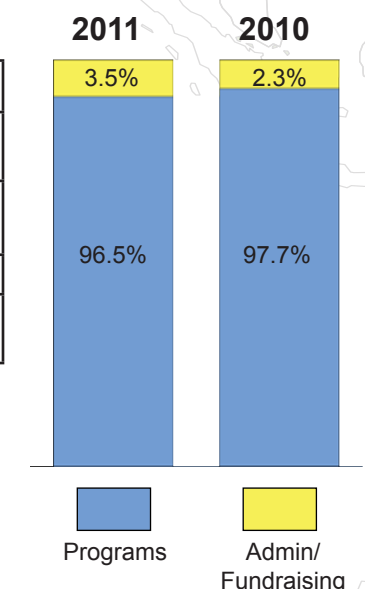
